Together, these finalist matters underscore Blaney McMurtry's ability to operate at the forefront of Canada's insolvency and restructuring landscape. The firm is regularly entrusted with complex, high-stakes files that demand strategic judgment and an ability to navigate competing stakeholder interests. These recognitions reflect Blaney McMurtry's strength in delivering sophisticated advocacy and commercially grounded solutions on matters of national significance, while retaining the agility, responsiveness, and partner-level involvement that define a leading Ontario regional firm.

Overall winners in each category will be announced at the Canadian Insolvency Awards Gala on February 5, 2026.
